# **Activity Report**

## **Orientation of NSS volunteers and Personality Development**

## 1. NSS Installation Programme

The NSS Unit Installation Ceremony for the Academic Year 2017-18 was held on 15th July, 2017 at Kreeda Prabodhini. The programme started with a welcome song based on the theme of environment, by the students of B.A.B.Ed. Principal Dr. M.R. Patil, welcomed the Chief Guest Shri. Govindraj Y. Desai, Principal of Harmal Panchkroshi Higher Secondary School, Harmal, Pedne-Goa, Special Invitee Shri. Sumantha M. Nayak, Teachers, Staff and NSS Volunteers to the Installation Programme. Dr. Sukhaji G. Naik, Vice-Principal, introduced the Chief Guest and Special Invitee. The Chief Guest installed the NSS Unit by watering a potted plant. After the installation, Shri. Rudresh Mhamal, NSS Convenor, read out the NSS report for 2016-17 and also presented the list of proposed NSS activities for the academic year 2017-18, which included the Green Campus project, anti-plastic drive, massive tree-plantation drives, etc.

## 2. Workshop on Digital India

NSS Volunteers of the college had attended workshop on Digital India on 20th September 2017 organised by Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Govt. of India. The workshop was organised to create a culture of volunteering amongst all sections of society and enhance access and understanding of online services/initiatives taken under Digital India.

## 3. Swachh Bharat Pakhwada (01st to 15th August, 2017)

To spread awareness on cleanliness as part of its 'Swachhta Abhiyan', the NSS Unit of Vidya Prabodhini College of Commerce, Education, Computer and Management, Parvari-Goa organised various activities such as cleanliness drive in the college campus and surrounding areas, plastic collection and recycling, and paper and cloth bag making and free-of-cost distribution, during the **Swachh Bharat Pakhwada** from 1<sup>st</sup> -15<sup>th</sup> August, 2017.

## a. Shramadan (1st to 7th August):

Shramadaan activities were executed by the NSS Volunteer through campus development. Each day between 2.00 pm to 4.00 pm, NSS volunteers along with NSS PO's conducted shramadaan in the campus and surrounding areas. In all more than 350 volunteers took part in the cleanliness drive during the Swachh Bharat Pakhwada.

# b. Anti-Plastic Drive (1st to 15th August)

Under anti-plastic drive three projects the volunteers carried out the following activities:

- i. Recyclable Plastic Waste Collection Drive: under this drive each volunteer was required to collect 50 plastic bottles or similar waste plastic items and get it to college. These items were than collected and given for recycling to scrap dealers. About 200 volunteers completed the drive and over 90 kg. plastic was collected and given for recycling.
- ii. Cloth Bags Making and Distribution Drive: under this drive each volunteer had to get 20 cloth bags stitched out of any used cloth. The same bags were then distributed by the volunteers to their neighbours free of cost, and the importance of using cloth bags and avoiding the use of plastic bags was explained by the volunteers to the public.
- iii. Paper bags making and distribution drive: under this drive a session was taken by Shri. Kalidas Mhamal (Assistant Professor in Fine Arts) on paper bag-making for the volunteers. Each volunteer then prepared 50 bags paper bags each out of old newspapers. The volunteers then distributed the same to the street vendors and

- shopkeepers around Parvari village for preventing use of plastic. 275 NSS volunteers took an active part in this drive.
- iv. Lectures and talks: A series of lectures and talks for NSS volunteers on Cleanliness, Health and Hygiene were conducted by Ms. Santoshi Narvencar, Assistant Professor in Environmental Studies, and Shri. Rudresh Uttam Mhamal, Assistant Professor in Commerce Vidya Prabodhini College, Parvari-Goa. One talk of each class was organised during the Swachh Bharat Pakhwada between 1st to 7th August 2017.





v. Poster Making Competition: Along with the above activities, a poster-making competition was also organised on Clean India – Green India. 24 team, of 2 volunteers each, took part in the competition. The best 5 posters were displayed on the notice boards for public display. The first three prizes along with two consolation prizes were awarded to the volunteers.

## 1. Swacchhta Hee Seva (2nd October, 2017)

The college organised Swacchhta Hee Seva cleanliness drives in five talukas of North Goa viz. On 15th September, 2017 a session on Road Safety was conducted by Shri. Minesh Tar, RTO Inspector. The programme started with a welcome address by Dr. M.R.Patil, Principal of the College. He also introduced the Resource Person for the session. Shri Rudresh Mhamal, NSS Convener, gave a floral welcome to Shri. Minesh Tar. RTO Inspector, Shri. Pravin Wadkar Dr. Sukhaji G. Naik, Vice-Principal, Faculty Members and Students were present for the session.

Shri.
