

# **About the College**



Vidya Parabodhini College of Commerce, Education, Computer and Management is the latest edition to this family, having started in the year 2012 affiliated to Goa University and Govt. of Goa recognized, offering three-year B.Com degree program. The third batch of Third Year students passed out in the year 2016-17 with an excellent performance, and the students of the fourth batch are awaiting the results of their Third Year examination held by Goa University in April, 2018. The College takes the credit for having started a unique program i.e. a Four-Year integrated B.A.B.Ed from the Academic Year 2015-16. The College also proposes to start B.B.A and B.C.A programs, for which the Govt. of Goa has already granted the College the necessary permission.

The College is situated in a spacious area at Vidyanagar, Parvari-Goa and has its own building with a 7,904 sq.mts. built up area. Besides a 4000 sq. mts. playground, the College offers excellent infrastructure facilities and a conducive learning environment. The College is also in the process of designing and developing different skill based short-term courses with an objective of enhancing the employability skills of our students. The College is also working actively to develop the Institution-Industry Network for placement opportunities for our students.

In order to bring a continuous improvement in the overall functioning of the college, the College has already setup Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), and this Cell is working in that direction. The key objective of the College is to impart a balanced holistic education to all its students and thereby develop young men and women who will be intellectually able, broad minded and disciplined citizens to serve the Nation in different capacities in various fields of life that they later choose for themselves.

# About the B.A.B.Ed. Program

The College takes credit for having started a unique program i.e. a Four-Year integrated B.A.B.Ed from the Academic Year 2015-16. The Four-Year Integrated Bachelors of Arts and Bachelors of Education Program, approved by the N.C.T.E. (National Council for Teacher Education) Govt. of India and the Government of Goa, is affiliated to Goa University under Section 24(1) of the Goa University Act (1984). The B.A.B.Ed. programme is governed by the Goa University Ordinance, OC-54, relating to the Four-Year Integrated Programme leading to the award of the degree of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Education (B.A.B.Ed.) (w.e.f. academic year 2015-16). The degree shall be Bachelors of Arts and Bachelors of Education (B.A.B.Ed.), and shall be awarded after the successful completion of the program. Notwithstanding anything contained in the ordinance, a successful candidate of the B.A.B.Ed program shall not be entitled for separate degrees of B.A and B.Ed.

#### **OBJECTIVE**

The objective of this course is to create competent and trained human resource in the field of Teaching and Education in the society, to draw talented and vocationally inclined youth (after HSSC or equivalent) in the vitally significant teaching profession and to infuse a sense of purpose and commitment in the aspiring teachers at a fairly early stage in their education. The program is under the faculty of Education without any lateral exit. An integrated approach to the teaching of languages and Social Science subjects is followed throughout the teaching program. Fine Arts, Performing Arts, Physical Education, Work Experience, Health Education and Working with the Community are also an integral part of the curriculum as per recommendations of the National Council for Teachers Education (NCTE). A core training program for developing teaching skills has also been introduced as a part of the program. The B.A.B.Ed. program is a full-time program of eight semesters, with a provision of vertical mobility towards M.A. and/or M.Ed.

#### **ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION**

There are 100 seats sanctioned for the programme. To be eligible for admission to the B.A.B.Ed. Program, a candidate must have passed the XIIth standard examination of 10+2 pattern of the Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary examinations recognised as equivalent thereto by the Goa University, with a minimum percentage of 50% as per NCTE norms. Reservation under various categories will be as per the reservation policy of the Government of Goa.

#### **ENTRANCE TEST AND ADMISSION**

The admission procedure to the program shall be as determined by the state Government/University.

#### **DOCUMENTS NECESSARY FOR B.A.B.ED. ADMISSION**

- 1. Application form
- 2. Original mark sheet of H.S.S.C./equivalent examination
- 3. Original copy & one self-attested copy of the H.S.S. Leaving Certificate.
- 4. Six copies of recent passport-sized photographs.
- 5. Anti-Ragging Undertaking form.
- 6. PTA form
- 7. I-card slip

- 8. Eligibility Certificate (in original) issued by Goa University and a Migration Certificate (for those students who have passed Std. XII or any other equivalent examination through any other recognized Board other than Goa Board, if applicable).
- 9. Students belonging to SC/ST/OBC should furnish the caste and Income certificate from the competent authority while submitting admission forms.
- Note: 1) The presence of Parent/Guardian is compulsory during the admission.
  - 2) The admission will be done purely on 'Merit Basis'.

## **Student Attendance**

The attendance rules for eligibility to appear for examinations conducted by Goa University are as per the norms laid out by the NCTE.

A student registered in a semester/term/year, for any course(degree or diploma), shall be required to have a minimum cumulative attendance of 80% of the total lectures and practical's prescribed for the course during that semester/term/year. Similarly, the student shall be required to have a minimum of 80% attendance in each individual paper/course.

A student having less than 80% cumulative attendance in a semester/term/year and/or less than 80% attendance in individual paper/course, shall not be eligible to appear for that semester/term/annual examination.

# **Scheme of Examination**

OC-54.3.1 There shall be continuous Intra-Semester Assessment (ISA) and Semester End Examination (SEE), for each of the Programmes. Examinations in Laboratory exercises shall be conducted for Courses having practical component.

(a)

- i. The continuous ISA shall be conducted by using various modes of evaluation such as assignment, presentation, orals, of which a written test shall form a compulsory component. Generally, ISA for a given Course shall be conducted by the teacher(s) teaching that Course. ISA shall not be conducted for the Practical component of a Course. The schedule for the ISA component shall be notified to all at the beginning of the semester. The marks of ISA shall be communicated to the students within two weeks.
- ii. The ISA components shall carry 30% of maximum marks and the SEE components shall carry 70% of maximum marks allotted for the courses.
- iii. Every College shall appoint a three member committee to monitor the ISA in the college. There shall be no remission in workload or remuneration for carrying out this work.
- iv. A student who fails to appear for a test due to a genuine reason shall be given another opportunity.
- v. A student who does not appear for the ISA tests shall not be eligible to answer SEE of that Course.

#### OC-54.3.3 STANDARD OF PASSING

- a) A student is required to score a minimum of 40% of the maximum marks in ISA and SEE components taken together, to pass in a course in Semesters I to VIII.
- b) A student is required to score a minimum of 50% marks to pass in practicum of each of the semesters.
- c) If a student fails a course, the marks secured in the ISA of that Course, shall be carried forward.
- d) An unsuccessful candidate who obtains the minimum percentage of marks prescribed for passing in a Course shall be exempted from reappearing in that course.

#### OC-54.3.4

- (a) To be eligible for a class, a student is required to complete the program in the minimum prescribed period and is required to pass all Courses of Semesters V, VI, VII and VIII in the first attempt.
- (b) The class shall be awarded on the basis of the aggregate total of marks scored at Semesters V, VI, VII and VIII taken together as follows:

70% and above – Distinction 60% to <70% - First Class 50% to <60% - Second class 40% to <50% - Pass Class

© A candidate, who does not clear all the Courses of Semesters V, VI, VII and VIII in the first attempt, shall not be eligible for any Class and shall be declared as "PASSES".







The Gymkhana room and other sports facilities are available for students only during recess or beyond their class hour. The Sports Council organises interclass competition in various sports events like Badminton, Football, Table Tennis, Chess, Cricket, etc. The College also participates in different sports competitions organised by Goa University and other colleges in the State. Students are entitled for sports merit marks to earn towards their sports participation at the end of every semester. Students are also allowed to participate in the State Level and National level tournaments organised by the respective associations.

**The Nisarg Club** is an initiative to generate, create and ensure adequate awareness about the environment among the youth. It serves with the motto, "We Nurture Nature".

**Vidyaprabodhini Itihaas Sankalan Samiti(History Club):** The History Club has been created with an objective to inculcate love and respect for culture and heritage. The Club conducts guest lectures and organises field trips to historical sites around the state every semester. In addition, the members also hold a Heritage Festival wherein students display traditional items from around the state and country.

**Career Guidance and Placement Cell** functions more as a career facilitation and personality development centre. The purpose of this cell is to apprise the students of the emerging work related/job opportunities and impart them sound counsel for an effective career planning.

#### **Book Bank**

The college has set up a student's Book Bank Scheme to ensure that all the students take part in the academic programme of the college and to inculcate the habit of reading books to equip themselves in the study and analyses of the subjects in day to day life.

#### Students' Aid Fund

The objective of this scheme is to render financial support to economically backward students to meet their tuition/examination fees in part or full or, to purchase books or meet any other expense as approved by the college authorities. Every student is required to contribute Rs. 100/- p.a. at the time of admission. Financial support under this scheme shall be considered only for those students whose family income does not exceed Rs. 2 Lakh p.a. Applicants shall be required to produce income certificate from the competent authorities. The beneficiary should not be in receipt of any other scholarships/assistance, except merit scholarships for the said academic year. A student who fails in the final examinations or/and is irregular in class will not be eligible for any assistance under this scheme.

#### **Students Welfare Fund**

Every month, teaching and non-teaching staff members contribute for Students' Welfare Fund and the amount contributed for the cause is spent for the Welfare of the students.

#### **Parents Teachers Association**

PTA was formed in the year 2012-13. It acts as an intermediary among parents, teachers and students. It undertakes various activities such as seminars, talks, financial assistance to needy students, academic support, etc. that benefits parents, students and teachers.

#### **Alumni Association**

The College has formed an alumni association with an objective to promote and foster mutually beneficial interaction between the Alumni and the present students of the College, and between the Alumni themselves. #### First-Aid


The College has a provision of first aid which can be obtained from the office, staff room & gymkhana.

# **Code of Conduct**

- All students are responsible to the Principal, teaching faculty and other college authorities in the college and on the campus.
- 2. Insubordination to any teacher or to any college authorities, use of indecent language, misbehavior or misconduct is liable for disciplinary action as per the rules.
- 3. The Principal's decision on all matters of the college shall be final and binding on all the students at all times.
- 4. Students are required to wear their identity cards when on the College campus and produce it whenever asked for by any College authority.
- 5. Loss of an Identity Card must be reported to the College Office immediately. A duplicate card will be issued on payment of the prescribed fee.
- 6. It is the responsibility of the student to read the notice board regularly for all important announcements and notices made by the college authorities from time to time. Students will not be excused or be given any concession on grounds of ignorance.
- Students must attend all lectures/tutorials/practical's as per the time-table on all working days. Absence without prior permission from the principal may lead to disciplinary action as per the directives of the Goa University and the College Authorities.
- 8. Students are expected to be seated in their respective classrooms at the stroke of the first bell and wait for the teacher. During lecture hours students are not permitted to loiter around the corridors. If a teacher is on leave, alternate arrangements will be made to engage the class. Students are prohibited to sit on the steps of the staircase or on the parapet of the building.
- The class representatives should inform the class in charge/mentor if there is no teacher to engage that particular lecture. Students are requested to make use of the library during free periods.
- 10. Absence from the College must be justified in writing and in the case of illness by a medical certificate.
- 11. Dress code/uniform prescribed by the College authority must be followed by the students. Indecent dressing such as plunging necks, low waist jeans, short T-shirts/Shirts, Miniskirts, slits, sleeveless displaying armpits, displaying of navel or underwear shall invite punishment in addition to fine.
- Smoking, chewing pan, chewing gum, consumption of any narcotic, alcoholic substance etc. in the classroom and on the campus is strictly prohibited.
- 13. Mobile phones are strictly prohibited on the campus and inside the classroom. If a student is found in possession of a mobile phone the same will be confiscated and returned at the end of the academic year on payment of Rs. 500/- as fine.
- 14. A student found in possession of pornographic material in any form will be seriously dealt with, in addition to confiscation.
- 15. The College has a zero tolerance policy towards sexual harassment and Ragging. Students are advised to abstain from indulging in such activities. A student, if found guilty of such acts will be liable for severe punishment in accordance with the regulations laid down by the UGC.

- 16. Students will not do anything within or outside the College, which may interfere with its administration, hamper the functioning of the College & prove in any way detrimental to the overall management of the college & its working.
- 17. The student who is found to have done damage of any description to the College property has to make good to damage done.
- 18. Students are not allowed to make complaints in a body or present any collective petition, but they are welcome to present their cases, if any, either individually or through their proper representatives.
- Students are prohibited from organizing tours, picnics, treks etc. by themselves. No student is allowed to collect contribution in money or kind without obtaining a prior sanction from the Principal.
- 20. The College is not responsible for loss of personal property.
- 21. No visitors/outsiders are allowed to meet the students in the college without the prior permission of the Principal.
- 22. Parents/Guardians are advised to contact the College authorities from time to time in order to apprise themselves of the progress of their wards and their attendance.
- 23. Genuine complaints by students will be entertained.
- 24. Students are prohibited to organize or attend any meeting within the College or to circulate among the students any notice or petition of any kind or paste it on the College notice board/walls without prior written permission of the principal.
- 25. Students are advised not to join any club or society or make any engagement that would interfere with their studies without the prior permission of the Principal. They are not allowed to play in any team against the College.
- 26. A student who wishes to apply for any certificate from the college shall approach the College Administrative Staff
- 27. The College reserves the right to withhold the final examination result of those students who fail to clear their dues (Breakage/Damage etc.) And/or return library books and other college items, within the notified time.
- 28. Use of Unfair Means during examination is strictly prohibited. A student, if found guilty, shall be liable for punishment as per the rules prescribed by Goa University.
- 29. Maintenance of College discipline, adherence to its rules & code of conduct & obedience to the instructions issued from time by the Principal or other college authorities will be mandatory & binding on each student & violation there to, will render the concerned student to appropriate disciplinary action including suspension, expulsion from the College & rustication in accordance with the relevant rules as per the Directives of the Goa University and the Guidelines formulated by the College Discipline Committee.
- 30. Matters not covered under the existing rules will rest at the absolute discretion of the Principal.

# **Annexure - I: UGC Regulations on Anti-Ragging**

#### UNIVERSITY GRANTS COMMISSION

UGC REGULATIONS ON CURBING THE MEANCE OF RAGGING IN
HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, 2009.
(Under Section 26 (1) (g) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956)
Dated June, 2009

#### **PREAMBLE**

In view of the Directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the matter of "University of Kerala V/S Council, Principals, Colleges and others" in SPL no. 24295 of 2006 dated 16.05.2007 and that dated 08.05.2009 in Civil Appeal number 887 of 2009, and in consideration of the determination of the Central Government and the University Grant Commission to Prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging including any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student, or indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or students, which causes or likely to cause annoyance, hardships or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other students, or asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of sane, torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student, in all higher education institution in the country, and thereby, to provide for the healthy development, physically or psychologically, of all students, the University Grant Commission, is consultation with the Councils, brings forth this Regulation.

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (g) of sub-section (1) of section 26 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956, the University Grant Commission hereby makes the following Regulations, namely

#### What constitutes Ragging?

- Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts: a. any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- b. Indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or student which cause or likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- c. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course to do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- d. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- e. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- g. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- I. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student

# Annexure - I: UGC Regulations on Anti-Ragging (contd...)

#### Administrative action in the event of Ragging:

The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed herein under:

- a) The Anti-Ragging committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
- b) The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely:
- I. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- II. Withholding / withdrawing scholarships / fellowship and other benefits.
- III. Debarring from appearing in any test / Examination or other evaluation process.
- IV. Withholding results.
- V. Debarring from representing the institution in any Regional, National or International meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- VI. Suspension / expulsion from the hostel.
- VII. Cancellation of admission
- VIII. Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters.
- IX. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
- X. Fine which may extend up to 2.5 lakhs. Provided that where the person committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
- c) An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall lie;
- i. In case of an order of an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of a University to the Vice-Chancellor of the University;
- ii. In case of an order of a University, to its Chancellor.
- iii. In case of an institution of national importance created by an Act of Parliament, to the Chairman or Chancellor of the institution, as the case may be.


