 - e) Enobarbus's loyalty to Antony.

- II. Write short notes on any three of the following: (3x5=15)
- a) Shakespeare's advice to his beloved in the Sonnet, "But wherefore do not you a mightier way."
 - b) The Chorus in Elizabethan drama.
 - c) The portrayal of envy in **Othello**.
 - d) A contrast between Cleopatra and Octavia.
 - e) The relationship between Cassio and Bianca in **Othello**.

- III. A) Attempt a critical analysis of the theme of deception in the Sonnet 138 "When my love swears that she is made of truth". 10

- B) Discuss Shakespeare's treatment of the youth's rare beauty in Sonnet 54 "O, how much more doth beauty beauteous seem".

- IV. A) Attempt an analysis of the character of Othello as a convincing Shakespearean tragic hero. 10

- B) 'Iago appears to be a man who embodies evil for the sake of evil.' Discuss the complexities of the character of Iago in **Othello**.

- V. A) 'Shakespeare's **Antony and Cleopatra** is a Roman tragedy of love and duty.' Discuss. 10

- B) 'Octavius Caesar is both antagonist and perfect foil to Mark Antony.' Attempt a comparison between the two in Shakespeare's **Antony and Cleopatra** in the light of the above statement.
- VI. A) Attempt a discussion on the nature of the typical Shakespearean tragedy. 10

- B) Discuss the nature of Shakespeare's historical plays.
