Delegates work together to create policy proposals called 'draft resolutions'. A successful MUN delegate is one who can introduce an idea from their opening speech and successfully get it onto the draft resolution, which is passed with a majority.

Participating in MUN conferences serves as a powerful platform for fostering global cooperation and refining a range of essential skills, including public speaking, debate, lobbying, and negotiation.

Discussing the Adoption of National Currency in Global Trade

Currently, the global trade landscape heavily relies on the US dollar. There are major calls to diversify currency options in global commerce to promote financial inclusivity and reduce dependency on a few dominant currencies. Delegates will explore the feasibility and implications of using national currencies for foreign exchange, including the impact on economic stability, exchange rates, and international trade relations.

Assessing the Impact of Digitalisation on Cross-Border Economic Activity

Digitalisation has profoundly reshaped global economic dynamics. There exists a need to analyse how technologies like digital payment systems impact international trade, considering cybersecurity and privacy concerns. Ensuring Peace and Security in Niger and the ECOWAS Region

On July 26, 2023, a coup occurred in Niger in which General Abdourahamane Tchiani replaced President Mohamed Bazoum as the de facto ruler of Niger. This resulted in the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) threatening to intervene in the restoration of the former president. Delegates will aim to maintain peace and security, both in Niger and throughout the ECOWAS region by combating hostilities between the opposing belligerents.

Addressing Rising Tensions Surrounding the Nile Dam Dispute

With Ethiopia pursuing the construction of the Grand Ethiopian Renaissance Dam (GERD) for energy production and export, Egypt and Sudan are increasingly concerned about water access. Delegates will tackle the escalating tensions and deliberate to find a balanced solution that ensures regional instability and fosters cooperation among the involved parties.

Ensuring the Autonomy of Law Enforcement Agencies

Since the time of the British Raj, political interference in Law Enforcement Agencies has been a feature of modern Indian political structures. Widespread consensus suggests that this decreases their effectiveness in upholding the rule of law and practising due process. Delegates will assess measures to reinforce the impartiality of law enforcement agencies to ensure they serve the public's interests

Deliberation on Decentralisation of Power with Special Emphasis on Powers of the Union Territories

Since Delhi gained legislative powers in 1993, its elected representatives have been embroiled in a continuous struggle with the central government over the division of authority. The recent passage of the Delhi Services Bill by the Indian Parliament, which appears to bypass a Supreme Court decision, has further intensified this ongoing dispute between the central government and its union territories. Delegates will engage in extensive deliberations on the allocation of powers, particularly in relation to Union Territories.

6th Session - Soviet Invasion of Afghanistan (Freeze date: 10th January 1980)

On January 10, 1980, the UNGA convened an Emergency Special Session tasked with addressing the pressing issue of the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan. Transported back to this critical juncture in time, delegates bear the crucial responsibility of not only comprehending the intricate web of events that led to this invasion but also paving a path towards peace and stability, all while navigating through the complexities of the Cold War.

Addressing Gender-Based Institutional and Legal Barriers

Across the globe, women face systemic discrimination through laws and institutions ranging from the repeal of reproductive rights to restrictions imposed through state morality policing. The committee aims to discuss these challenges objectively and seek ways to reduce gender discrimination through legal and institutional reforms, promoting equality for all.

Addressing Gender Equality and Inclusivity in Sports

Sports possess the ability to foster gender solidarity, transcending societal gender stereotypes and negative norms. It is crucial to secure inclusivity and equal opportunities for all genders in sports by addressing disparities in participation, leadership, and funding. Delegates will deliberate on strategies to establish an equitable arena where athletes of every gender can excel and receive recognition for their accomplishments.

Establishing a Comprehensive Child Welfare Framework for Orphans

Orphaned children face many vulnerabilities stemming from the absence of parental care. They grapple with limited access challenges such as to education. healthcare, and stable living conditions, as well as enduring social stigmatisation and emotional turmoil. Delegates will address factors healthcare. like guardianship, and access to vital resources to cultivate a nurturing and supportive environment, enabling vulnerable children to flourish and make meaningful contributions to society through a comprehensive framework.





Advancing Juvenile Justice Reform for Protection of Children's Rights

Juvenile offences refer to acts of disobedience of the law, performed by minors, which often arise from neglect. Reforms in juvenile justice are crucial to prioritise rehabilitation and the well-being of young offenders, fostering fairness and safety. This committee seeks to foster equitable systems, promoting positive growth and bolstering the safety and resilience of social justice systems. Delegates will work to protect children's rights in legal proceedings, focusing on rehabilitation and preventing future crimes.
