




ACADEMIC PROGRESSION IN LAST FIVE YEARS






Average change in passing percentage in last five years = +6.02%






*** BACHELOR OF COMMERCE**

Three Year Choice Based Credit System Programme of B. Com: Excerpts from Ordinance OC-66Excerpts of the relevant ordinance, OC-66, relating to the Three-Year Choice Based Credit System Programme of Bachelor of Commerce and Bachelor of Commerce degrees (under section 24(1) of Goa University Act 1984(effective from the A.Y.2017-18) is reproduced as under:

OC-66.1 General

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) provides choice for students to select from the prescribed courses. Under the CBCS, the requirement for awarding a degree is prescribed in terms of number of Credits to be completed by the students.

OC-66.3 Programme structure: .

- 1. The Programme shall be based on a system of time-integrated Units called Credits, under the CBCS.
- 2. The Programme shall comprise Courses such as Core, Elective and Ability Enhancement Courses.
- 3. A Credit shall consist of 15 clock hours of theory of 1 hour duration each or 15 practical classes of 2 hours duration each, per semester or its equivalent; field work and such other as recommended by the Board of Studies (BoS) shall be considered under practical category for calculating credits and workload.
- 4. One credit shall carry a maximum of 25 marks.

5. A student shall be eligible for the award of Bachelor's Degree on successful completion of minimum of 132 credits, to be completed over a minimum of six Semesters. A student shall be eligible for the award of Bachelor's Degree on successful completion of minimum of 148 Credits, to be completed over a minimum of six Semesters.

B. COM – UNDER NEP 2020 (F.Y.B. COM)

OA-38 Ordinance Governing the Undergraduate (UG) General Education Programmes

The Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (CCFUP) under National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 envisages the incorporation of a flexible choice-based Credit system, multidisciplinary approach with multiple entry and exit options, to facilitate students to pursue their career path by choosing the subject/field of their interest.

The General Objectives of the Programme:

- (i) To recognize, identify, and foster the unique capabilities of each student to promote her/his holistic development.
- (ii) To provide flexibility, so that learners can select their learning trajectories and Programmes, and thereby choose their own paths in life according to their talents and interests.
- (iii) To impart multidisciplinary and holistic education across the sciences, social sciences, arts, humanities, and sports.
- (iv) To emphasize on conceptual understanding rather than rote learning; critical thinking to encourage logical decision-making and innovation; ethics, human & constitutional values; life skills such as communication, teamwork, leadership, and resilience
- (v) To encourage extensive use of technology in teaching and learning, removing language barriers, increasing access for Divyang students, and educational planning and management.
- (vi) To provide respect for diversity and respect for the local context in all curricula, pedagogy and policy.
- (vii) To uphold equity and inclusion as the cornerstone of all educational decisions,

- to ensure that all students are able to thrive in the education system, and the institutional environment is responsive to differences, to ensure that high-quality education is available for all.
- (viii) To have rootedness and pride in India, and its rich, diverse, ancient, and modern culture, languages, knowledge systems, and traditions.

Duration of the Programme

- (i) The duration of the UG Programme shall be of Four Years/Eight Semesters with multiple entry and exit options.
- (ii) A student may also be permitted to take a break from the Programme during the period of study.
- (iii) The total duration for completion of the UG Programme shall not exceed seven years from the date of initial registration.
- (iv) Every Academic Year shall consist of two Semesters.
- (v) In addition, there shall be a Summer Term during the vacation.
