

# about the department



The Department of English was established in 2012 in the year of the college's inception. The department is committed to training young learners in the fields of language, literature and translation with a multidisciplinary approach. The curriculum which comprises literatures of the world includes gender studies, culture studies, literary criticism, post-colonial Indian Literature, post-world war literature, Absurd Drama etc. with specific allied papers like American Studies and Creative Writing, Translation Theory and Practice and Sociology of Literature. The faculty constantly upgrade their academic and pedagogical skills to adapt to the global trends in language and literature.

The department has one Full-time Regular and two Contract-basis faculty members.

- Collaborate with English departments in colleges across the state to encourage communication between peer groups





# **Strengths**

- Qualified and well-trained faculty members:
  - Faculty attend Faculty Development Programs (FDPs), seminars, workshops and conferences to • keep themselves abreast of the trends and • innovations in the field.
- Enthusiastic faculty members, who execute their creative ideas through departmental activities like literary festivals, seminars, workshops, field trips, addon courses etc.
- Positive and genial teacher-student relationship that enhances the quality of the teaching-learning experience
- Students have performed consistently well at the university-level examinations

# **Weakness**

- Extensive curricular pressure that sometimes limits extra-curricular and academic activities.
- Research output is minimal.
- The department does not offer six-unit elective papers at TYBABED or FoYBABED.
  - There has been a permanent vacancy of one full-time faculty in the department, which takes time to get filled in as a contractual post, due to administrative processes. This impacts lectures for the first few weeks of the odd semester each year.

# **Challenges**

- NEP 2020 and NCTE norms, and the uncertainty about workloads have prevented any changes to the programme structure or course curriculum.
- With the NCTE introducing ITEP the faculty strength will be reduced drastically.
- The current syllabus being implemented has been phased out for the B.A. programme by Goa University since 2017.



# **FYBABED SEMESTER I**

# Spoken English

# **Course Objectives**

- The course aims to develop the language skills of listening, reading and writing.
- The course covers most of the basic skills required for completing an undergraduate program in the English medium and to be able to undertake other day-to-day personal and professional transactions using English as the medium of Communication.
- The prescribed texts help the students increase their proficiency in English by enhancing their resources to deal with the communicative needs of everyday life at home, at work, and in social interaction.
- The material, methodology and language tasks create contexts for interaction and language use so that learners acquire and sharpen their language skills as they process the text on their own.
- The prescribed grammar book provides rules, explanations and examples in an easy, accessible language supported by pictorial representations (wherever possible) with practice exercises on the facing page. This format allows for easy reference so that students are able to internalise the rules.
- The course covers 3 out of the 4 language skills: listening, reading and writing.

### **Course Outcomes**

- Provide relevant information.
- · Explain and give cause and effect.
- Disagree, argue and use persuasive speech in appropriate language.

# Introduction to Poetry and Drama

## **Course Objectives**

- Learners should be able to recognize and define a few important forms of poetry such as sonnets, odes, ballads, and elegies.
- Understand and appreciate the literal sense of the poem, form, imagery, tone, special devices, and symbolic meaning if any.
- Understand two major forms of drama- tragedy and comedy.

### **Course Outcomes**


- Know and identify rhyme, rhythm and metre.
