## Principal's Report

Village and Campus to Community." Each stakeholder worked with dedication toward achieving the institution's objectives and remained committed to the college's vision, mission, and overall goals. The success of 2023-24 was not only remarkable but extraordinary, highlighted by three major milestone achievements. Firstly, the college became the only recipient of the PM-USHA 3.0 scheme in the state of Goa and received a grant of Rs. 5 crore under the "Grant to Strengthen Colleges" component for the year 2024, initiated by the Government of India. Secondly, the college was ranked among the top 300 institutions in India by the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF). Lastly, and most significantly, the college was awarded an A+ Grade with a CGPA of 3.42 out of 4 in the second cycle of NAAC Accreditation during 2024.

I take this opportunity to express my heartfelt gratitude to the members of Prabodhan Education Society, teaching and administrative staff, students, parents, alumni, and all stakeholders for their unwavering support and cooperation. Without the guidance of the management and the dedication of the staff and other stakeholders, achieving these three milestones in a single year would not have been possible.

Another notable aspect of the academic year 2023-24 was the rapid infrastructure development at the college. Within a span of just one year, the college established a state-of-the-art Board Room for organizing meetings and functions. The library was renovated and its seating capacity expanded to accommodate more than 120 users. The ICT lab was redesigned and now houses 50 computers equipped with the latest technology. The Department of Physical Education and Sports was renovated, with an independent cabin for staff and enhanced sports facilities for students. The college has always practiced decentralized management and promoted it through the provision of independent renovated cabins for the Vice-Principal, Heads of Programs, and the Coordinator of IQAC, along with cubicles for staff members, the librarian, and the counselor. Additionally, the exam room and the geography lab were revamped. The college expanded its plant nursery, redesigning it to cater to community needs. Construction of a new Conference Hall on the fourth floor is in progress, with plans for other infrastructural developments such as the expansion of the college canteen and the construction of additional classrooms on the fourth floor in the pipeline.

The teaching and administrative staff are integral to the progress and development of the institution. This year, Dr. Nitesh Naik, Librarian, completed his Ph.D. in Library Science, and Dr. Anil Thosare was awarded the Rashtriya Shiksha Ratna Award by Real Indo Global Vision Social Development Gurukul Foundation, Dhule, Maharashtra. I also extend my appreciation to Ms. Yogita Chodankar and Shri Saish Nayak Dalal for their editorial contributions to the books Chingari and They Said Valiantly, and to the four faculty members who published research papers in UGC-Care listed journals. Additionally, many faculty members attended orientation and sensitization programs on the National Education Policy 2020 conducted by MMTTC, Goa University—an important step forward in the implementation of NEP 2020.

The college received an excellent response from prospective students during the academic year 2023-24, with 120 students admitted to the first-year B.Com. program and 100 to the first-year B.A.B.Ed. program. This year, first-year B.Com. students were admitted as per the course structure of NEP 2020, and the college submitted an application to the NCTE for converting the current B.A.B.Ed. program to the Integrated Teacher Education Program (ITEP). The results of the final-year students were exemplary, with 11 B.Com. and 63 B.A.B.Ed. students passing with distinctions. The Placement Cell organized four placement drives, providing students with valuable employment opportunities.

The college organized over 50 events this year, contributing to the all-around development of students. College teams participated in and won prizes at intercollegiate events such as Kaushalya (organized by V.M. Salgaoncar College of Law, Miramar), Equinox 2024 (organized by Zantye College of Commerce, Bicholim), Anantara (organized by Shree Damodar College of Commerce and Economics, Margao), Plexus 2024 (organized by Goa Medical College, Bambolim), Srujansangam 2024 (organized by Goa Marathi Academy, Panaji), the 23rd Yuva Konkani Sahitya Sammelan (organized by Goa Konkani Akademi, Panaji), Hindi Srujanotsav 2023 (organized by the Institute of Menezes Braganza, Panaji), Mahanaam 2023 (organized by Ganpat Parsekar College of Education, Harmal), and Youtheisa 2024 (organized by Goa University, Taleigao). In addition to academic and cultural events, our students, including Rushil Velingkar, Makhan Hazra, Laxmesh Pawane, Pavina Salgoankar, Yashmita Talwadkar, Kajal Kashyap, Pusha Vishwakarma, Tanvi Khedekar, and Tanvi Naik, represented the state at the national level in sports. I congratulate all the winners and participants in academic, cultural, and sports events and wish them success in their future endeavors.

The NSS Unit and the Nisarg Club worked proactively on activities such as a beach clean-up drive, Millet week celebrations, and Vanamohotsav. The college also organized a rally to raise awareness about AIDS. Cost-effective rainwater harvesting storage systems were set up, and the college continued emphasizing environmental sustainability by displaying all 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and highlighting its contributions to each goal. This unique initiative helped stakeholders become more aware and informed about their roles in achieving the SDGs.

The Red Ribbon Club, in association with the Goa State AIDS Control Society, organized flash mob dances at Mall De Goa and prominent public places in Panaji. Additionally, 32 individuals visited Goa Medical College, Bambolim, and donated blood in emergency cases. The Medical Centre organized a health check-up camp for all stakeholders.

The college conducted two certificate courses this year: one in Event Management and another in the Basics of Sanskrit Language. Co-curricular activities included interclass competitions such as Ghumat

Samvad and Srujanostav. The Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) and Alumni Association played active roles in organizing workshops and events for students. The PTA gifted students a book on the Indian Constitution, and copies of Yuva Prerna were distributed to students on National Youth Day.

The Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) Study Centre-08033, which has been operating on campus since 2017, expanded its offerings this year. The center, which provides seven bachelor's programs and one postgraduate diploma, introduced postgraduate programs such as the M.Sc. in Geography and the M.A. in Rural Development. I congratulate the staff of the study center for enrolling 2,200 students during the academic year.

The college, in collaboration with the Directorate of Higher Education and the Goa State Commission for Women, organized a two-day national conference titled Gender Writes: A Dialogue on Rewriting the Gender Narrative, held on April 12-13, 2024, at Sanskruti Bhavan, Panaji-Goa. The conference was attended by 140 participants, with Prof. Santishree Pandit, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, as the keynote speaker.

All the important committee meetings of the College Advisory Committee, Local Managing Committee, Internal Quality Assurance Cell, and College Planning Board were conducted as per statutory requirements, and the suggestions received were implemented. I express my sincere gratitude to the Chairman of Prabodhan Education Society (PES), Shri Sanjay Walavalkar, Secretary Shri Rajendra Bhobe, Treasurer Shri Vithal G.P. Parrikar, and all the honorable executive council members of PES. I also thank the Parent-Teacher Association and Alumni Association for their continuous support and look forward to their valuable suggestions for future improvement.

I am delighted to present the milestone achievements of the college and look forward to even greater accomplishments in the future, driven by our vision: Excellence Everywhere Everytime

I extend my heartfelt thanks to the Magazine Editorial Committee, staff, and printers for their efforts in bringing this magazine to fruition.

#### **Objectives:**

#### The Nisarg Club has undertaken several initiatives. Following are the major initiatives:-

#### 1. Nisarg Club Nursery:-

The college has developed its own nursery and well-maintained nursery including medicinal plants, ornamental and floral plants with the help of members of Nisarg club. It has more than seventy of different varieties of plants along with medicinal plants which are tagged with their biological nomenclature and QR code generated for the information of each species. The College nursery is unique initiative which includes almost every one of the species of plants.

## 2. Turtle Conservation and Coastal Clean-up initiative

The College offers a 3-year B.Com and a 4-year integrated B.A.B.Ed Programme. For both programme there is a continuous Intra-Semester assessment (ISA). The ISA for the theory component of a Course is conducted twice or three times in a given Semester, once through a written test, and the other second or third by using alternate modes of evaluation including assignment/presentation/orals / such other. The ISA component is 20 marks for both the 100 mark and 50 papers for B.Com and 30 marks and 20 marks for 100 marks and 50 marks papers for B. A. B. Ed respectively. The students have to answer two or three Intra semester exams. An optional extra ISA is also conducted especially for slow learners and those who have missed an earlier exam. For those students who answer all ISAs, the best marks scored in the required number of the ISAs are considered for the result. The nature of Intra semester assessments are either Written/Oral, Open/Closed book, Scheduled/Surprise, Objective/Multiple-choice, Short answer type, Essay type, Seminar, Assignment, Experimental work, Fieldwork, Viva-Voce, Peer group assessment, or Class participation.

Generally, the ISA for a given Course is conducted by the teacher/s teaching that Course. The schedule for the ISAs is notified to all at the beginning of the Semester. The marks of ISA are communicated to the students within two weeks. ISA I is preferably completed by the end of July for odd Semesters and the end of January for even Semesters. Repeat ISAs are conducted for those students who have missed the written test for some genuine reason (medical grounds, participation in State/ National /International sports, events/ NCC/NSS). The repeat ISAs are generally conducted in August for odd semesters and February for even semesters, on a date pre-determined by the College. ISA II will be completed as decided by the teacher but before the end of theSemester. A student who does not appear for two or three ISAs of a Course is not eligible to answer the SEE of that Course.

Transparency is maintained by showing the students' assessed answer sheets of the Intra Semester Assessment (ISA). The Goa University ordinances are strictly followed for the conduct of ISA.

For the academic year 2023-24 Odd semester B. Com Programme the first ISA was conducted from 9th August to 12th August 2023 and the final date of submission ISA 1 and 2 mark was date 7th October 2023.

The first ISA test Odd Semester for B.A.B.Ed. Programme was conducted from 9th August to 12th August 2023 and 7th October 2023 was the last date for the submission of final marks for all the ISAs for all courses in B.A.B.Ed.

In the Academic year, 2023-24, for the even semester the first ISA for B.Com was held from 12th February to 14th February 2024and ISA 1 and 2 final submission date was 6th April 2024.

The first ISA test for Even semester the B.A.B.Ed programme was conducted from 13th February to 16th February 2024. The last date for the submission of 1st, 2nd& 3rd ISA marks was 6th April 2024.

#### ONE-DAY WORKSHOP ON RESEARCH WRITING AND RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

The RRC works to reduce new HIV infection among youth by raising their risk perception through awareness on Sex, Sexuality and HIV & AIDS and also to induce among youth the spirit to help and support People living with HIV/AIDS (PLHIV) there by reducing stigma and discrimination against PLHIVs.

Further RRC also helps to promote Voluntary non-remunerated Blood Donation among youth.

The students and the faculty members of the institution are encouraged to voluntarily donate blood during blood donation camp organized by the institution and also on the formal request on the college office number 08322410500 during emergencies occurred in Govt. as well as Pvt. Hospitals.

The RRC unit of the college organizes various activities related to HIV/AIDS, and Blood Donation awareness in order to induce knowledge about the same among college students. The RRC unit of the college felicitates the blood donors who donates blood during emergencies. The RRC Unit also gives the publicity to the blood donors by displaying congratulatory message on the college screen.

## **NAAC STEERING COMMITTEE**

The College has been awarded an 'A+' grade with a CGPA of 3.42 by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in its second cycle of accreditation. This marks a significant improvement of 0.49 grade points from the previous cycle, where the College received a CGPA of 2.73 with a 'B+' grade.

#### The details of the assessment process and timeline are as follows:

- The College submitted its Institutional Information for Quality Assessment (IIQA) on 16<sup>th</sup> September 2023, which was accepted on 11<sup>th</sup> December 2023.
- The Self-Study Report (SSR) was subsequently submitted on 23<sup>rd</sup>December 2023.
- The first Data Validation and Verification (DVV) process was completed on 6<sup>th</sup>February 2024.
- An in-person Peer Team Visit was conducted on 19<sup>th</sup>and 20<sup>th</sup>March 2024.
- Following this, the College received an email from NAAC recommending a reassessment of the DVV, with the reassessment results declared on 22<sup>nd</sup>June 2024.

Despite the improvement, the College is not fully satisfied with the grade awarded and has applied for the appeal process on 5<sup>th</sup>August 2024.

## **COUNSELLING CELL**

The counsellor plays an important role in the institution by providing students with counselling services when they are in need, as well as spreading awareness on sensitive topics.

At the commencement of the academic year, the counsellor conducts an interactive orientation session in each class, where they:

- Introduce themselves and brief the students about their qualifications.
- Clarify myths about counselling.
- Explain the counselling process.
- Address queries regarding confidentiality.
- Describe the counselling approach used.
- Identify situations that can be addressed in counselling sessions.
- Explain how students can approach the counsellor.

It is the counsellor's duty to be unbiased and nonjudgmental in their approach, irrespective of the students' gender, cultural, ethnic, racial, sexual orientation, and religious backgrounds.

The counsellor works with individuals and groups to improve their mental health and well-being, helping students define their goals, plan actions, gain insights, and develop pathways toward achieving their goals through various alternatives. The counsellor also acts as a facilitator to help students take care of their holistic health (mind and body).

Issues addressed include depression, anger, relationships, abuse, bullying, stress, self-image, LGBTQ issues, grief, and suicide. In some cases, the counsellor may refer students to psychiatrists, a step that is communicated during the intake session. The counsellor adheres to the Code of Ethics prescribed by the American Psychological Association (APA).

#### **NEED FOR COUNSELLING:**

The counsellor receives cases on stress management, such as difficulty in handling emotional outbursts. Students can directly approach the counsellor during free lectures or based on the urgency of their matter.

Post-pandemic, cases of students feeling low and experiencing a loss of self-confidence have been observed. Most cases are related to a loss of 'self,' where students feel worthless and disconnected from their past extroverted selves. They prefer isolation and avoid high-anxiety social situations. In counselling sessions, involvement of parents/family occurs only if required.

#### THE PROCESS OF COUNSELING SIMPLIFIED:

#### Intake Form/Intake Session

The counsellor informs the student about counselling terms and conditions, the need to maintain written records, and keeps e-copies/ handwritten copies of each counselling session.

#### RAPPORT BUILDING

After agreeing to the terms and conditions, the counsellor focuses on building a therapeutic bond with the student, allowing them to discuss their troubled situations. The counsellor uses empathy and nonjudgmental open-ended questions for clarity.

#### PROBLEM ASSESSMENT & GOAL SETTING

The counsellor actively listens and asks open-ended questions to gain more insight into the student's situation without being intrusive. Problems are mutually identified, and goals are chosen by the student through brainstorming.

#### COUNSELLING INTERVENTION

The counsellor plays a vital role in identifying any distorted or irrational thoughts the student might have while working towards their goals. These insights are brought to the forefront for the student to actively address. These could be unconscious patterns or behaviours of which the student might not be aware.

## EVALUATION, FEEDBACK, AND TERMINATION

Evaluation checks if the student successfully achieved their set goals. The student is equipped with tools for future situations, and feedback helps gauge satisfaction and boosts confidence and self-esteem. Termination occurs when:

- The student achieves their goals.
- The student is no longer interested in gaining counselling help.
- Before the counsellor's employment tenure ends.
- Situations Where Confidentiality is Broken:
- Confidentiality is breached when:
- The student's life is in danger or they have suicidal ideation.
- The student might cause harm to others.
- Records of counselling sessions are required by law.

Students are informed of these criteria before starting counselling sessions. Confidentiality is broken if students show signs of suicidality, and the Principal of the college and the students parents are informed to ensure the student's well-being and safety.

## FREQUENCY OF SESSIONS:

Students are free to approach or discontinue counselling as they see fit. Sessions typically range from 5 to 10, with the suggestion for weekly sessions. If a session is deemed unproductive, the student may be referred to another counsellor or a psychiatrist.

#### **REFERRALS:**

Referrals are made when psychiatric intervention might be necessary, especially in cases of psychological disorders that cannot be managed in counselling sessions. These referrals may involve the prescription of medicines to address symptoms by the referred psychiatrists.

## **MINORITY CELL**

#### ABOUT THE CELL

Since the inception of the college we have been promoting as well as supporting an Inclusive educational policy. We look on to encourage open dialogue, multicultural events, and student organizations that celebrate diversity .Students irrespective to which ever community they belong to participate in several cultural, sports , social and intellectual events including contesting student council elections. Each and every student in the college is given a fair opportunity to showcase their talent and also represent the college in events like singing, dancing, participating in games and other activities.

This remarkable achievement underscores the college's leadership in higher education. The institution was Sanctioned with an amount of Rs. 5 Crore to implement the project.

Following the approval, the college was required to prepare a detailed expenditure plan and plan of action. The proposal was categorized into three primary components:

- 1. Infrastructure Construction
- 2. Infrastructure Renovation
- 3. Infrastructure Purchases
- 4. Soft Components

Extensive discussions were held between the PM-USHA Committee, contractors, and stakeholders to finalize the plan of action and expenditure plan. Once completed, the finalized proposal was uploaded to the PM-USHA portal.

As part of the ongoing process, the college began preparing the Detailed Project Report (DPR), which includes the action plan, blueprints, and the construction and Renovation progress. For this, quotations from various vendors were collected and evaluated to initiate construction and renovation activities.

The DPR highlights several major projects, including:

- The construction of a Multipurpose Hall
- Renovation of the Library
- Renovation of the College Canteen

This project marks a significant milestone for Vidya Prabodhini College. While the DPR finalization is underway, there is still much to be accomplished to bring the vision of this project to fruition.

- Financial information, including receipts and expenditures.
- Infrastructure availability.
- Scholarships, loans, and accreditation status

The AISHE 2022-23 was launched on 15<sup>th</sup> January 2024. Regular meetings of the college AISHE committee were held to collect the data required to complete the DCF. A workshop on AISHE was organized by the Directorate of Higher Education, Govt. of Goa, on 12<sup>th</sup> February 20224.

The DCF was successfully submitted through the AISHE portal on 04<sup>th</sup> March 2024, for which the college received a certificate. After submission, the data undergoes verification processes to ensure accuracy and completeness, and the collected data is analyzed and compiled into reports that the Ministry of Education publishes.







### **CHANDOR: "THE HEARTBEAT OF GOA'S ANCIENT PAST"**

Chandor is a well-known, traditional village in Goa, On the banks of the Kushavati River. It show vibrant Portuguese culture, which is visible in its streets and surroundings. Its beauty lies not only in its unique architecture but also in the stunning landscape, with green hills and fields full of crops and plantations.

The village of Chandor was known as "Chandrapur" and was once the capital of the Kadamba dynasty, which ruled Goa from the 6th to the 11th century. Chandrapur remained the capital until 1054, when the Kadambas moved to Old Goa (Goa Velha). Later, when the Muslims invaded Goa, the Kadambas returned to Chandrapur. However, they were eventually driven out again by the Portuguese when they arrived in Goa.

After the Portuguese came into the power they started demolishing all the old Hindu temples and in its place started constructing churches and chapels. A significant discovery in the area was the copper plates of Dev Raja of bhoja dynasty found in shiroda Goa it provide is the earlier known epigraphical reference to chandrapur the inscription is dated to the 3th and 4th century A.D.

#### **HEADLESS NANDI**

Isvorachem is the location of hindu temple dedicated to lord Shiva. Fr. Heras excavated this site and discovered in 11th century. It is believed that Muslims had once desecrated the Nandi statue by cutting open its stomach, hoping to find diamonds, pearls, or other valuable stones. They also broke its mouth, chopped off its tail, and damaged its legs in their search. However, they didn't find any treasure. Architectural layout: Sanctum (Garbhagriha): The main room where the Shiva Lingam is kept for worship. Nandi Statue: A headless Nandi statue is placed in front of the sanctum, which is the temple's unique feature. Mandapa (Pillared Hall): A small open hall in front of the sanctum where people can gather for rituals. Courtyard: An open area around the temple for people to walk around the sanctum and Nandi statue. The temple is made of laterite stone and follows the simple style.

#### THE MENEZES BRAGANZA HOUSE

The Menezes Braganza House, is a grand mansion built in the 16th century. It belonged to the powerful Menezes Braganza family, one of the most important families in Goa during the Portuguese era. The house is a beautiful example of Indo-Portuguese architecture, blending European and Goan styles. It features carved wooden furniture, arches, high ceilings, and large rooms filled with antique items and old paintings that show the life of the wealthy during colonial times.

The house also has lovely verandas, spacious courtyards, and gardens with views of the countryside. Over the years, it has been a place for social gatherings and political meetings. The Menezes Braganza House is not only an architectural gem but also a key part of Goa's history, preserving the region's cultural heritage.

## **CURSE OF THE QUEEN**

However, the village was invaded, and King Harihar of the Kadamba dynasty was killed. the people of Chandor were devastated by his death. The palace was looted, and in their sorrow, the princesses and court ladies destroyed their jewels and threw themselves into the river, which is said to still have traces of gold powder on its banks. The queen, however, was away at the time. When she returned, she found the city ruins and despair it was then that the sad news of the king, her husband, being killed in

the battle was told her. she was struck with grief and anger. she removed all her jewels, Crushed them and threw them all over the place, and cursed the women of Chandor, wishing them all to be like her a widow she came out of the fort-less and stamping her feet four times, said she would not take away anything, not even the dust, of her feet from the city and then Committed suicide.

The Stone having her foot prints seen outside and Can be seen still remains the chapel of st. Tiago, which is situated at the entrance of the fort area This xrapacho fator' (Cursed stone) is still dreaded by the villagers of chandor.

Their outgoing women be blessed Incoming women widows become!"

#### MUSSOL DANCE

Another tradition that the Christian 'Kshatriya' of Chandor has passed on its generation is the Mussol Dance. The main theme of this dance is to celebrate the victory of the king Harihar of Vijayanagar in the early 14th C. The Mussol Dance is a traditional dance, performed during religious festivals and special events. It's a energetic dance that celebrates Goan culture, usually done to honor local gods or during feasts. The dance is performed by a group of men and women who move in a rhythmic pattern, while traditional Goan music and drumming play. The dancers use sticks, hitting them together in a coordinated way, creating a rhythmic sound that adds to the excitement. It also shows the mix of Goan and Portuguese cultures.

#### THE FERNANDES HERITAGE HOUSE

The Fernandes Heritage House ,is a well-preserved example of colonial Portuguese architecture. Built in the 17th century, the house showcases traditional Goan design with its elegant blend of European and Indian influences. The house features antique furniture, wood carvings, and vintage artifacts, offering visitors a glimpse into the rich history and lifestyle of the region during the Portuguese era. The house contains a secret passage, hidden under a wooden panel, which the family used to hide during local rebellions against the Portuguese. This passage leads to a safe room below the house. There was once an underground tunnel from this room that connected directly to the riverbanks, allowing quick escapes in times of danger. However, no trace of this tunnel remains today.

#### CONCLUSION

Chandor is known for its reach historical and architectural heritage, reflecting the influence of Portuguese colonial rules in the region. The village boasts several notable structure, including ancient churches and traditional Goan houses. One of its most famous landmark is the church Of our lady of the mount, which showcase a blend of Portuguese and Indian architectural style. Chandor is also holds historical significance as it was once the site of residence of Portuguese and played a role in the regions colonial history.

## **ABBÉ FARIA**

Abbé Faria (1756–1819) was a Portuguese Catholic priest and one of the most prominent figures of the late 18th century in Europe, particularly known for his contributions to the field of hypnotism and his intellectual work. He is often regarded as a precursor to modern hypnotism, and his life was marked by a combination of scientific inquiry, spiritual exploration, and political involvement.

#### EARLY LIFE AND EDUCATION

Abbé Faria was born in 1756 in the small town of São João Nepomuceno, located in the state of Minas Gerais, Brazil, though his family hailed from Portugal. He was educated in Lisbon, where he initially pursued a religious path, entering the seminary to become a priest. However, Faria's intellectual curiosity led him to explore a broad range of subjects beyond theology, including philosophy, science, and psychology. He was well-versed in the works of many Enlightenment philosophers, particularly those related to human consciousness and mental states. His studies would later inform his ideas about the mind and its potential manipulation through what he referred to as "animal magnetism," a concept developed by Franz Anton Mesmer, a German physician. However, Faria would develop his own unique theories that significantly deviated from Mesmer's methods.

#### POLITICAL AND SOCIAL INVOLVEMENT

Aside from his work in psychology, Faria was also politically active, particularly in the context of the French Revolution. He was imprisoned for several years in the Château d' If, the same prison featured in Alexandre Dumas' novel The Count of Monte Cristo, although Faria's life there was quite different from that of the fictional character. During his imprisonment, Faria spent much of his time writing and formulating his ideas. His association with political revolutionaries and his intellectual pursuits made him a target of the authorities. While in prison, Faria continued to challenge religious and political norms. He was a vocal critic of the Church's influence over social and political life and advocated for a more rational, scientific approach to understanding human existence. His views on liberty, reason, and human potential resonated with many Enlightenment thinkers, and he shared these ideas with other prisoners, including the future Count of Monte Cristo, Edmond Dantès, who would later recount Faria's influence on his own intellectual development.

#### CONTRIBUTION TO HYPNOTISM

Faria is perhaps best known for his work in developing and refining the concept of hypnosis. While Mesmer believed that a "magnetic fluid" could be transferred from one person to another to cure various ailments, Faria rejected this notion and instead argued that hypnosis was a psychological phenomenon, not a mystical or supernatural one. He believed that it was possible to induce a trance-like state in individuals through suggestion, concentration, and the power of the mind. In his research and public demonstrations, Faria used a method of verbal suggestion to induce a trance state in his subjects. He theorized that hypnosis was a state of focused attention in which the subject could be more susceptible to suggestion and could experience alterations in perception, memory, and even physical sensations. His approach to hypnotism was scientific, based on observation and experimentation, and he sought to explain it through naturalistic principles rather than supernatural ones. Faria's ideas were groundbreaking for their time and laid the foundation for what would later become the practice of modern hypnosis. His work was influential on the development of hypnotherapy, as well as in the broader study of the mind and its connection to the body.

#### LEGACY AND INFLUENCE

Abbé Faria's legacy is often overshadowed by the more famous figures of his time, yet his contributions to both hypnotism and psychology are significant. His work demonstrated the power of the human mind to influence bodily states and behavior, and his scientific approach to the phenomenon of hypnosis was a precursor to the later development of clinical hypnosis and psychotherapy. Faria's influence extended beyond the realm of psychology. His ideas about the mind, free will, and the potential for personal transformation through mental discipline resonated with later thinkers and movements. His rejection of mystical explanations for hypnosis and his insistence on rational, scientific inquiry set him apart from many contemporaries and earned him respect among Enlightenment intellectuals. In the 19th century, his work was integrated into the growing field of psychology, and many modern psychologists and therapists can trace the roots of their practices back to Faria's pioneering work in the field. His contributions continue to be recognized in the history of medicine, psychology, and even literature, particularly through his connection to the figure of the Count of Monte Cristo, whose character reflects many of the ideas Faria espoused during his life.

In summary, Abbé Faria was a visionary who contributed significantly to the understanding of human consciousness and the psychological processes behind hypnosis. His rejection of mystical and supernatural explanations in favor of a rational, scientific understanding of the mind helped pave the way for future advancements in psychology and therapy. Despite the fact that his work was not fully appreciated during his lifetime, Faria's intellectual legacy has endured and remains an important part of the history of psychology and the development of therapeutic practices.

Temperatures during these months can drop to 20oC. Nights are cooler. Though the humidity is still present, days are more pleasant, making this period the most preferred time for tourist to make a visit to Calangute. Winter usually last till Mid-February.




Fig 1.2. Bar Graph




Fig 1.4. Bar Graph

शब्द हा दोन अक्षरांचा पण त्यात किती वर्षाचा अनुभव आहे. परंपरा व मर्यादा यांचे धडे गिरवत स्वतः मात्र चंदनासारखी झिजली. पण त्याचा सुवास मात्र आमच्यात मायेच्या रूपाने अजूनही दरवळत आहे.

#### ग्रामीण शालेय ग्रंथालयाची स्थिती काय?

गोव्यामध्ये अनेक शाळा अशा आहेत जिथे पुस्तके तर आहेत पण पुस्तके ठेवायला खोली नाही. खोली आहे तर पुस्तकांबरोबर खे-ळाची साधने आहे. काहीकडे तर शाळेचे सामान ठेवलेले आहे. अशी अवस्था काही शाळांमध्ये आढळते. अनेक शाळेतील ग्रंथालय फक्त नावाचे ग्रंथालय बनून राहिले आहेत. दिलेला पाठ्यक्रम वेळेवर संपिवणे हा शिक्षणाचा हेतू बनून राहिला आहे. काही शाळांमध्ये ग्रंथालयाच्या तासाला फक्त पुस्तक देणे यावरच थांबते. बहुतेक शाळांमध्ये ग्रंथालय तास इतर विषयांच्या शिक्षिका घेतात, त्या मुळे ते आपल्या विषयाचे विश्लेषण त्या तासाला करत असतात. काही शाळांमध्ये ग्रंथालयासाठी शिक्षिका नसतेच तेव्हा इतर विषयांची शिक्षिका घेते. त्यामुळे असे जाणवते की वाचनाकडे शिक्षिका लक्ष देत नाही. शिक्षक असून सुद्धा मुलांना ती पुस्तक वाचायला प्रवृत्त करू शकत नाही, केवळ पुस्तक देतात व ते वाचा म्हणून सांगतात. पण खरंच का ती मुले ते पुस्तक वाचातात, याचा शोध घेण्यास असक्षम ठरतात.

अशी ही दुर्मिळ परिस्थिती अनेक शाळांमध्ये झालेली आहे. शिक्षकांच्या मते पुस्तक वाचणे हे कृत्य साधारण बनत चालले आहे व पाठ्यक्रम संपवणे त्यांची मूळ निष्ठा बनून राहिली आहे. आपल्याकडील अशी धारणा बहुतेक शाळांमधील पाहायला मिळणार.

मुलांनी शाळेत फक्त पाठ्यक्रम तोंड पाठ करून चालत नाही तर वेगवेगळी पुस्तके वाचून त्यातून आदर्श, ज्ञान, आनंद, यश मिळवायला हवे. शाळेमधील असलेले पुस्तकांचे ढीग शोभेसाठी नाहीत. पुस्तके का वाचावी, कशी वाचावी याचे मार्गदर्शन शिक्षकाने करणे अवाश्यक आहे. पण ती पुस्तके ना शिक्षक वाचतात ना मुले वाचतात. सर्वात प्रथम शिक्षकांनी पुस्तकांचे जबरदस्त वाचन केले पाहिजे पण काही शिक्षक मोकळ्या वेळेस हातात भ्रमण ध्वनी घेऊन बसलेले आढळतात.

जेव्हा शिक्षक वाचत असतो तेव्हा मुले देखील वाचायला प्रोत्साहित होतात. ती अशी की शिक्षक वेगवेगळी पुस्तके वाचून ज्ञान मिळवीत असतो व मुलांच्या शिक्षणात त्याचा वापर करत असतो. वाचन प्रेमी शिक्षक मुलांना वयोगटाप्रमाणे पुस्तके सूचित करतात. शिक्षक जेव्हा वेगवेगळी पुस्तके वाचणार तेव्हा त्याला कोणत्या स्तराला कसली पुस्तके द्यायची याचा अंदाज मिळणार. शिक्षिका पुस्तके वाचते म्हणून मुलेही वाचायला सुरू करतात.

शाळेतील ग्रंथालय म्हणजे सर्वव्यापी गुणाचे शृंगार असते याची जाणीव सर्व प्रथम शिक्षकांना होणे गरजेचे आहे. तरच ते मुलांच्या अंगी त्या शृंगाराचा बीज पेरू शकतात. मुलांना पुस्तक प्रेमी करायची प्रतिक्रिया फक्त शिक्षकांचीच नव्हे तर त्या शाळेतील मुख्यद्द्यापकाचीही असणे गरजेचे आहे. मुख्याध्यापकाने आपल्या शाळेत वार्षिक पुस्तक कार्यक्रम आयोजित करणे महत्त्वाचे ठरेल. ज्यामध्ये पुस्तक वा—चनावर वेगवेगळे कार्यक्रम होऊ शकतात जसे की नाटक, गोष्टी, कविता लिहिण्याची, वाचण्याची स्पर्धा, गोष्टींचा आशय सांगण्याची अशी वेगळ्या प्रकारची त्या त्या इयत्तेसाठी स्पर्धा आयोजित करणे आवश्यक ठरणार. पुस्तकालय फक्त नावासाठी नसावे तर त्याचा व्यवस्तीत पणे उपयोग व्हायला हवा तेव्हाच कुठे वाचाल तर वाचाल या म्हणीला बळ मिळेल.

शालेय ग्रंथालयाचे महत्त्व लक्षात घेऊन वाचन उद्दिष्ट्ये सफल करण्यास उत्तम रीतीने संयोजन होणे आवश्यक आहे. शालेय ग्रंथालयात गेल्यावर विद्यार्थ्यांना वाचन करण्याची इच्छा होईल, तेथे बसावेसे वाटेल असा वर्ग असावा. ग्रंथालय शिक्षकाने पुस्तकांविषयी चर्चाही घडवून आणाव्यात. त्यामुळे पुस्तकांचा चिकित्सक रीतीने अभ्यास होईल.


